	Criteria are the specific qualitative goals and guidelines by which preservation work is measured.	
	Score is a quantitative value of the criteria. It is 0 - 3: 0 = none or less than 25% of the criteria are met 1 = 25% of the criteria are met	
	2 = around 50% of the criteria are met 3 = 75% or more of the criteria	
	Each <u>Aspect</u> can have a maximum score of 3 and minimum score of 0, for a maximum total score of 15.
